Next Meeting – June 9, 2011 – Rush Street Grill

Minutes of the ABCS Meeting held on May 12, 2011

The May ABCS Meeting was held on May 12, 2011. The meeting was called to order by Peter Davis who announced that we had a record number of visitors at the May meeting - 6! He also said that the club had tried to get flowers to Paul Kern for Glenice's funeral, but unfortunately were unable to do so in time. Paul McRoy spoke to Paul Kern via email and asked him to let us know if there is a charity that we can send money to in Glenice's honor. Peter then told the group that one of our members, David Wallace, had the roof blown off of his house in the tornados that swept through the Abingdon/Glade Spring area. He said that prior plans to attend the Barter Theatre would probably be postponed until later in the year. Paul McRoy spoke briefly regarding the drive to Cass, WV. He said that when he called back to reserve the cabins, there were none available, but that he had talked to someone at a local motel about 10 minutes from Cass who could accommodate the group. Ben Bailey said that he would not recommend the motel because of a past experience. Paul said that he would research alternate places to stay in the area. Ben said that there were some chain motels in Marlinton, about 20 miles from Cass. Paul said that he had also found a

restaurant at Snowshoe (The Embers) for the group to go to on Saturday night and passed around a menu for everyone to view. Paul also said that we could get boxed lunches for the train ride on Saturday for around \$8.99/person. The train ride will be \$25/person and the train leaves at noon. We will leave for Cass at 9:00 on Friday morning. He also told the group that that night was the deadline for deposits for the trip. It was announced that some who would be heading to Car Show in Townsend would meet at the Bush plant at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 14th. Those coming from Johnson City and Kingsport would meet at the McDonalds in Greeneville at 9:00 a.m.

Brarry Cox then gave a very informative presentation on the Philippines and began by showing some slides explaining the way that the military is set up. He went over the USARPAC (U.S. Army Pacific) mission and what it entails. He talked about the area that they cover – a 9,000 mile area from east to west. He spoke about the major threats - the environment, competing for resources, terrorism, pandemics, narcotics, piracy, etc. He also discussed the violent extremist organizations in South and Southeast Asia. He explained how the Theater Security Cooperation Plan works and how the U.S. partners with the Phillipino military to erect schools, provide free clinics and provide veterinary services.

Brarry then showed several videos about large staff exercises, crisis intervention, training for deployment, medical readiness training exercises, giving to local schools and strengthening community relations. Also highlighted was a video about a joint force mission that works to give free medical, dental and optometric care. Another video focused on Special Forces training and live fire exercises.

The 50/50 drawing was then held and Buzz Davies won the cash. Following the 50/50 was the drawing for the door prize, which was won by one of our visitors – a friend of the Calcotes'.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
